## **Training to Become an EMT**



EMT—Basic training is offered at various tech college campuses and at off-campus locations. As a graduate you will be able to:

- Provide efficient and immediate care to critically ill and injured patients
- Make decisions under stress
- Work quickly in situations requiring accuracy
- Question patients to obtain medical and personal history
- Deal with adverse social situations including on site of an emergency

Graduates of the EMT—Basic program complete the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians Exam to become licensed.
