Approximately **115,000** people in Wisconsin are living with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. This number is projected to increase by **68%** in 2035. Specifically, in Ashland County, there are an estimated **400** people living with dementia, and in Bayfield County there are an estimated **500** people living with dementia. This does <u>not</u> include those who are living in assisted living facilities, nursing homes, or other care facilities.
